CAMBRIDGE ENGLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR HIGHER EDUCATION – KEY FACTS

Cambridge English Qualifications are based on research into effective teaching and learning. They motivate people of all ages and abilities to learn English and develop practical skills for the real world.

Each exam focuses on a level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)*, helping learners to improve their speaking, writing, reading and listening skills step by step.

Include Cambridge English Qualifications as part of your institution's published English language requirements to gain reliable proof of a students' real-life communication skills and reach a wider pool of candidates.

B2 First

An upper-intermediate qualification which demonstrates that students have the practical English skills needed for foundation and pathway courses, pre-university programs and community college admissions.

C1 Advanced

A high-level, focused academic English exam which shows that students have the English language skills they need to succeed at undergraduate and graduate level.

C2 Proficiency

C2 Proficiency is our highest level qualification, it proves that students have the English skills to study demanding subjects, including undergraduate and graduate programs.

Exam fees	Fees vary as they are set locally by centers to ensure that they are affordable for students.	
Exam format	 Each exam is available in paper-based or computer-based format. The exams cover Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking, as well as Use of English and vocabulary. The Speaking test is always face to face. Candidates take the test with two Cambridge English examiners and one other candidate. Results issued	 2–3 weeks from exam date for computer-based version 4–6 weeks from exam date for paper-based version. 	
Results format	 Results for B2 First, C1 Advanced and C2 Proficiency are reported on the Cambridge English Scale. Candidates receive a Statement of Results which shows: scores for each of the four skills (Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking) and for Use of English an overall score, which is an average of their individual scores. Candidates are also awarded a Grade (A, B, C) and CEFR level. For more information visit: www.cambridgeenglish.org/understanding-results 	
Results Verification Service	You can use our free, secure online Results Verification Service to check a candidate's results for all three exams: www.cambridgeenglish.org/verifiers Students are required to supply their Candidate ID number and Secret number to allow institutions to verify results. These two numbers are included on the candidate's Confirmation of Entry, which they receive from their center when registering for the exam.	
Expiration of results	Because B2 First, C1 Advanced and C2 Proficiency are in-depth exams, results do not expire. You can choose how long scores are acceptable for your institution and purpose.
