# At a glance - what's new?

#### Cambridge English: Starters (YLE Starters)

Part	What's been updated?				
1	There is a new Part 1 task. Instead of placing objects on the picture, children will need to match names to people. This is now the same task as <i>Movers</i> and <i>Flyers</i> Part 1, but is targeted at Pre-A1 level.
