

A1 Movers Reading and Writing Part 1

Description

This lesson plan has been designed to help students prepare for A1 Movers Reading and Writing Part 1. This lesson plan can be delivered face to face or online. The 'online options' column gives teachers ideas about how the stages could be adapted for teaching online.

In this lesson students develop confidence identifying places, people and objects. They do this by reading written descriptions before constructing their own. Further practice is provided with an A1 Movers Reading and Writing Part 1 task.

Note to teachers: The vocabulary and descriptions included in this lesson plan are from **A1 Movers Reading and Writing Sample paper, volume 1**.

Time required:	40 – 60 minutes
Materials required:	 Flashcards Handout 1 – Wordsearch Handout 2 (A/B) – Crossword A1 Movers Reading and Writing Part 1 (pages 42 & 43) https://www.cambridgeenglish.org/Images/423014-cambridge-english-young-learners-sample-papers-2018-volume-2.pdf
Aims:	 To review A1 Movers vocabulary To help students identify places, people and objects from a written description.

Procedure:

Lesson Stages	Online options
Welcome	
Greet students and demonstrate a memory name game:	Ask your students to do this by
Saying "Hello, I'm [your name] + [another word starting with your initial], what's your name?"	turning their microphones on.
For example, "Hello, I'm A nna A pple, what's your name?"	
Prompt a confident student to reply "Hello Anna Apple, I'm [name] + [another word starting with their initial], before asking another student what their name is.	
Repeat with all students, encourage them to help each other if they forget or cannot think of a word. Make light of any mistakes.	



Vocabulary challenge

Put students into groups.

Cover <u>Flashcards</u> with a sheet of paper, then when holding them up (so all students can see them) slowly move the covering sheet of paper to reveal a small part of a flashcard image. Ask students to guess what the picture is.

Award points to the first group to guess correctly, repeat with the other flashcard pictures. Use your platform's whiteboard to display the picture – and a drawing object to cover it.

Otherwise, print <u>Flashcards</u> and use another sheet of paper to do this stage over your webcam

Finding and matching words

Give out <u>Handout 1</u>. Set a time limit for students to find vocabulary within the wordsearch.

Check answers and ask students to complete Part 2 of Handout 1.

Check answers by pointing to a picture and:

- asking for the name
- asking if it is a person/job, a place or a thing
- asking how it is different to other jobs / places / things

Share <u>Handout 1</u> with students' parents before the lesson, so they can print and provide copies of the worksheets.

Alternatively display the wordsearch on a collaborative whiteboard (for example, https://jamboard.google.com/) and allow students to complete the wordsearch collaboratively.

Complete Part 2 by displaying the images on your platform's whiteboard and asking students to type the pictured words in the chat.

Board slaps (reading race)

Stick <u>Flashcards</u> on your whiteboard or on an area of classroom where all students can reach them.

Put students into groups and choose one student from each group to come to the flashcards (try to choose students with a similar level of English).

Slowly write a description of one of the flashcard images. For example, "It's a place with lots of cars and tall buildings." Prompt students to slap the image being described (a city) as soon as they can identify it. The first group to get it right wins a point.

Repeat with other flashcard images before congratulating winners.

Display the flashcard images wordsearch on a collaborative whiteboard (for example, https://jamboard.google.com/). Put students into teams, giving each a different colour.

Students race to circle the picture you describe, winning a point for their team. Repeat with other pictures.

Making a crossword

Split the class into two groups, A and B. Give a copy of Handout 2 - Group A to one group and Handout 2 - Group B to the other.

Tell students you will now do a different kind of word game: a crossword. Explain this is an unusual crossword because they

Share handouts with parents, or students through your platform before the lesson.


If students are unable to write on printed handouts, ask them



must unjumble the clues first and then write answers to their partner's clues. Do an example together, demonstrating how to unjumble the words to make a crossword clue.	to look at a copy on their screen while writing answers in a notebook.
Allow students to individually unjumble the crossword clues, before checking and sharing them with students from the same group. Quickly check that everyone's clues are OK.	
Doing a crossword	
Make new groups that include Group A and Group B students.	If you are able to safely manage breakout rooms, use them for
Students take turns to share their crossword clues with their group mates, who listen and write the answers on their copy of Handout 2.	this stage, so students can share crossword clues and discuss answers.
Check answers.	Otherwise take turns choosing a student from each group to share a crossword clue with the whole group.
Exam practice (optional extension/homework task)	
For further practice, give students a copy of the A1 Movers Reading and Writing Part 1 sample paper (pages 42 & 43, from https://www.cambridgeenglish.org/Images/423014-cambridgeenglish-young-learners-sample-papers-2018-volume-2.pdf)	This activity can be completed individually – either during the class or as homework.
Ask students to complete the task, before comparing answers with a partner.


